Measures on the November Ballot

Measure 115: Impeachment of Elected State Executive Amendment.

Vote no. The party already in power will only wield the power of impeachment to advance their standing in the public mind and further their own ambitions.

Measure 116: Independent Public Service Compensation Commission Amendment.

Vote no. Passage of this measure creates a new governmental department that will determine salaries and compensation. We need to cut government, not expand it.

Measure 117: Ranked Choice Voting for Federal and State Elections.

Vote no. Keep the people's choice for the one candidate with the most votes. Keep the control of the ballot counting out of the states and save a lot of money.

Measure 118: (Initiative 17) **Corporate Tax Revenue Rebate for Residents Initiative**. (Adds 3% tax on corporate sales above \$25 million and distributes that money to residence, including dependence or wards who have resided in the state or at least 200 days.)

Vote no. This measure essentially steals \$3 billion from the public in the form of a sales tax. It is funded by a California billionaire, and ushers in Universal Basic Income, pushing a socialist agenda under the guise of a "rebate check."

Measure 119: Unionization of Cannabis Workers Initiative.

Vote no. If the voters make silencing business owners "legal" then there will never be any opposition. Measure 119 is also unconstitutional because it violates the free speech, the free association, and the free assembly rights of businesses in Oregon.
